

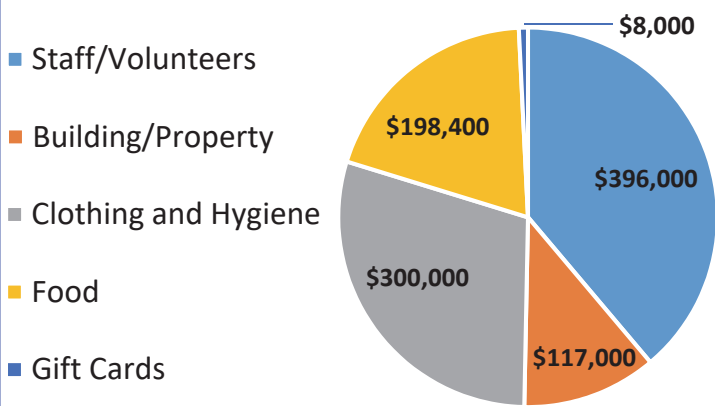
Christian Assistance Ministry Annual Report

CAM THE EMERGENCY ROOM OF SOCIAL SERVICES

Founded in 1977 by nine downtown churches, CAM provides immediate assistance to those in emergency crisis situations. Much like an emergency room treating patients with serious chronic situations or people with one time issues, clients are able to come to CAM and receive help immediately with no appointment or demographic requirement. CAM impacts many community issues by being an important first step toward self-sufficiency or by overcoming a barrier that would prevent a client from moving forward. In addition, we help clients avoid falling so far behind financially that they require long-term community support. CAM's services positively impact issues relating to homelessness, spousal abuse, working poor, mental and physical health, and poverty.

Today CAM has the support of 86 churches and is able to serve over 50,000 clients annually. Working out of two donated locations we are able to provide food, clothing, hygiene items, financial assistance for things like ID recovery, prescriptions and utility assistance, a free mailbox, and transportation for work or medical needs. We do all of this without any government support. This is possible in part by leveraging every dollar given into two. Your dollars, donations of food, clothing, and hygiene items; coupled with a fulltime staff of nine and an incredible volunteer base of over 200, make it possible for us to keep overhead extremely low and stretch all money given into twice the initial amount.

CAM PROVIDES

- 40,000 were provided food
- 18,000 were provided clothing
- 4,426 individuals received financial assistance (prescriptions, utilities, and ID help etc.)
- 2,000 were given transportation for medical and work
- 300 served through Back to School
- 870 served through the Christmas Shop
- 300 received a free hair cut for employment

FORTY YEARS OF PURPOSE



CAM is incredibly proud to have been serving those in crisis and great need for 40 years! Last year we unveiled a new logo referencing Leviticus 23:22 *“When you harvest the crops on your land, don’t cut all the way to the corners of your field. Don’t pick up the grain that falls on the ground. Leave it for the poor...”* The wheat symbol and question **“How will you share your harvest?”** became a very important part of our message to ourselves and to others. This year we see another reference, **“Not cutting your corners”**.

This is what the founders of CAM envisioned in 1977 as well as the opportunity to share that God does provide if we obey. What we realized was that at the time this scripture was written, these wheat fields would have looked quite unusual to someone passing through in need. These travelers could visibly see a wheat field harvested but they would be surprised by these very large corners left to feed those in hunger. They would have known that this farmer had obeyed God’s command by providing for those in need. Furthermore, the receiver would also know that God had answered their prayers.

40 years ago the founding churches and church leaders who created CAM heard God’s command and took action! They created CAM on the corner of McCullough as a beacon of help and hope for those in need.
