DOESN'T ALWAYS GO AS PLANNED



At CAM's downtown location there are quite a few people that come to the property experiencing homelessness. We have a little chapel and open it up each morning for anyone who wants to attend and a different pastor or leader from various churches hosts a morning Bible Study and prayer. The number of attendees varies and we know that this is church for many of those we serve. Sometimes they are linked to a particular day and pastor they like, others come every day, and others periodically. Our Monday pastor, from First Presbyterian Church, Mitchell Moore, shared that he showed up one Monday with a prepared lesson and eager to serve. When he arrived, there was only one woman in the Chapel. When he walked in she stood up and began asking him questions and they stood in the middle of the room in conversation. He quickly learned she wasn't interested in the lesson he had planned and had her own spiritual needs and agenda. He also felt a little disappointed that there weren't any others there and that he wasn't going to be able to use his lesson. We all get it, we work hard to do great work and it doesn't go as planned. He also shared that as they stood

there in conversation, she asking spiritual questions and he answering her, a few others started to come into the chapel; it was getting late and many of them were there to sign up for the showers that day (the chapel is the shower waiting room too). They weren't even there for Bible Study. Soon he realized that a little circle had formed around him and the woman and that now others were benefitting from the lesson the woman needed and he was meant to provide. This is so much the case of the ministry at CAM. We open the doors, prepare, and God makes a way for us to meet the real need. It's just **What Love Does**.

CAM was founded back in October 1977 by 9 downtown churches. Fast forward to today, and CAM is now supported by over 100 churches and has completely transformed into an organization doing so much good for this community. CAM is still the emergency room of social services, with a goal of helping people experiencing homelessness and economical disadvantages. CAM continues to provide food, clothing, financial assistance and other critical services to more than 70,000 people every year, serving as a safety net for people affected by poverty and financial issues. CAM is the second largest food pantry in San Antonio, offering food services daily. CAM is unique among nonprofits in that it does



not have demographic requirements, making anyone in need eligible to receive its services. We're grateful to receive the support we've received the past 45 years. Those who have invested in CAM have shown us that they believe in our mission and what we do for the city of San Antonio. Here's to 45 more years and counting!

A COMMON LANGUAGE



CAM does many things to help people in crisis but much of our initial purpose is to simply be there for people. Our presence allows us to walk in their shoes, understand their needs, and stand next to them in a time of crisis. While providing financial assistance, clothes, or food is vital; sometimes it's a connection that is as equally important. Our Northwest location, on the property of

University United Methodist Church, sees many working poor families. This location is also close by many migrants who have been given safe haven in San Antonio because they have been displaced from war torn countries such as Syria. One day our director, Teresa Martin, observed a little boy from a middle eastern country who couldn't speak English, getting frustrated in the waiting room. He had a hand held video game but couldn't get it to work and he was so upset. Another little boy was in the waiting room, this little boy was from the United States and only spoke English but he could speak the language of frustration and video games. He slowly moved closer to the other little boy and reached out his hand to help him. He fixed the video game and they sat there together playing it and communicating in the language of video games and play. It was a beautiful exchange and hopefully imprinted on the boys the power of caring and commonality. It's just **What Love Does**.
