I.D. RECOVERY: PROVIDING HOPE

CAM's ID recovery program and the volunteers who help us do this work, truly demonstrate the incredible processes and services CAM has developed over the years in order to help people move forward in life. As you may or may not imagine, getting an ID requires many documents that people we serve may no longer have nor ever had. Due to things like domestic violence and escaping a home, they may leave their documents behind. Their family may have had to move many times and they lost original birth certificates or social security cards. They may have lost everything when they became homeless. It may not have been updated or lost while they were incarcerated.

The thing that makes it all so hard, is that you can't get an original birth certificate without some proof of ID, and you can't get a Social Security Card without a birth certificate. Ironically enough, you need both of those documents to get a picture ID. As you can see, it's not just the financial assistance that is hard but the process in and of itself that's difficult. This is how CAM helps with all of the above. People need this ID to get a job, obtain housing, or even to enter a shelter if they are homeless. It is vital and very stressful for individuals who may have lost everything, have little money, and may have no transportation.

do this work; so that we can always have this vital service available to those we serve!

Most recently a seasoned volunteer who has truly learned the processes for individuals to gain an ID was meeting with a client. When the client walked in, she was a little intimidated. He had been recently released from prison, was a very big man, and had many tattoos. He explained that his probation officer and even a family member had tried to help him get his ID, but they were not successful. He was worried, upset, and frustrated; he needed it to work, he needed someone to hear him and help him. Our sweet volunteer, Darcy, was able to use the tools she now has after working with the system for years at CAM, and was able to get his ID renewed online and paid for by CAM. As she sat with him finalizing the details, he began to weep. She was so moved that this big, strong man was weeping for joy. This meant he could begin life and take care of himself. Darcy is currently training other volunteers to
